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# Section I - Instructions to Applicants

## 3. Fraud and Corruption

1.1 In connection with the invitation for Prequalification indicated in Section II (Prequalification Data Sheet) (PDS), the Employer, as defined in the PDS, issues this Prequalification Document ("Prequalification Document") to prospective applicants ("Applicants") interested in submitting applications ("Applications") for prequalification to bid for the Works described in Section VII (Scope of Works). In case the Works are to be bid as individual contracts (i.e., the slice and package procedure), these are listed in the PDS. The Request for Bids (RFB) number corresponding to this prequalification is also provided in the PDS.
2.1 The Borrower or Recipient (hereinafter called "Borrower") indicated in the PDS has applied for or received financing (hereinafter called "funds") from the International Bank for Reconstruction and Development or the International Development Association (hereinafter called "the Bank") in an amount specified in the PDS, towards the cost of the project named in the PDS. The Borrower intends to apply a portion of the funds to eligible payments under the contract(s) resulting from the Bidding for which this prequalification is conducted.
2.2 Payment by the Bank will be made only at the request of the Borrower and upon approval by the Bank, and will be subject, in all respects, to the terms and conditions of the Loan (or other financing) Agreement. The Loan (or other financing) Agreement prohibits a withdrawal from the loan (or credit) account for the purpose of any payment to persons or entities, or for any import of goods, equipment, plant or materials, or services if such payment or import, to the knowledge of the Bank, is prohibited by a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations. No party other than the Borrower shall derive any rights from the Loan (or other financing) Agreement or have any claim to the proceeds of the loan (or credit).
3.1 The Bank requires compliance with the Bank's AntiCorruption Guidelines and its prevailing sanctions policies and procedures as set forth in the WBG's Sanctions Framework, as set forth in Section VI, Fraud and Corruption.
3.2 In further pursuance of this policy, Applicants shall permit and shall cause their agents (where declared or not), subcontractors,
subconsultants, service providers, suppliers, and their personnel, to permit the Bank to inspect all accounts, records and other documents relating to any initial selection process, prequalification process, bid submission (in case prequalified), proposal submission, and contract performance (in the case of award), and to have them audited by auditors appointed by the Bank.

## 4. Eligible Applicants

4.1 Applicants shall meet the eligibility criteria as per this ITA and ITA 5.1 and 5.2.
4.2 An Applicant may be a firm that is a private entity, a state-owned enterprise or institution subject to ITA 4.8 or any combination of such entities in the form of a joint venture ("JV") under an existing agreement or with the intent to enter into such an agreement supported by a letter of intent. In the case of a joint venture, all members shall be jointly and severally liable for the execution of the entire Contract in accordance with the Contract terms. The JV shall nominate a Representative who shall have the authority to conduct all business for and on behalf of any and all the members of the JV during the prequalification process, Bidding (in the event the JV submits a Bid) and during contract execution (in the event the JV is awarded the Contract). Unless specified in the PDS, there is no limit on the number of members in a JV.
4.3 A firm may apply for prequalification both individually, and as part of a joint venture, or participate as a subcontractor. If prequalified, it will not be permitted to bid for the same contract both as an individual firm and as a part of the joint venture or as a subcontractor. However, a firm may participate as a subcontractor in more than one Bid, but only in that capacity. Bids submitted in violation of this procedure will be rejected. ${ }^{1}$
4.4 A firm and any of its affiliates (that directly or indirectly control, are controlled by or are under common control with that firm) may submit its application for prequalification either individually, as joint venture or as a subcontractor among them for the same contract. However, if prequalified, only one prequalified Applicant will be allowed to bid for the same contract. All Bids submitted in violation of this procedure will be rejected.
4.5 An Applicant may have the nationality of any country, subject

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to the restrictions pursuant to ITA 5.1 and 5.2. An Applicant shall be deemed to have the nationality of a country if the Applicant is constituted, incorporated or registered in and operates in conformity with the provisions of the laws of that country, as evidenced by its articles of incorporation (or equivalent documents of constitution or association) and its registration documents, as the case may be. This criterion also shall apply to the determination of the nationality of proposed specialized sub-contractors or suppliers for any part of the Contract including related Services.
4.6 Applicants shall not have a conflict of interest. Applicants shall be considered to have a conflict of interest, if they, or any of their affiliates, participated as a consultant in the preparation of the design or technical specifications or have been hired or proposed to be hired by the Employer or Borrower as Engineer for contract implementation of the Works that are the subject of this prequalification. In addition, Applicants may be considered to have a conflict of interest if they have a close business or family relationship with a professional staff of the Borrower (or of the project implementing agency, or of a recipient of a part of the loan) who: (i) are directly or indirectly involved in the preparation of the prequalification Document or Request for Bids (RFB) Document or specifications of the Contract, and/or the Bid evaluation process of such Contract; or (ii) would be involved in the implementation or supervision of such Contract, unless the conflict stemming from such relationship has been resolved in a manner acceptable to the Bank throughout the prequalification, RFB process and execution of the Contract.
4.7 An Applicant that has been sanctioned by the Bank, pursuant to the Bank's Anti-Corruption Guidelines, and in accordance with its prevailing sanctions policies and procedures as set forth in the WBG's Sanctions Framework, as described in Section VI, paragraph 2.2 d . shall be ineligible to be prequalified for, initially selected for, bid for, propose for, or be awarded a Bank-financed contract or benefit from a Bankfinanced contract, financially or otherwise, during such period of time as the Bank shall have determined. The list of debarred firms and individuals is available at the electronic address specified in the PDS.

4.8 Applicants that are state-owned enterprise or institutions in the Employer's Country may be eligible to prequalify, compete and be awarded a Contract(s) only if they can establish, in a manner acceptable to the Bank, that they (i) are legally and financially autonomous (ii) operate under commercial law, and (iii) are not under supervision of the Employer.
4.9 An Applicant shall not be under suspension from Bidding by the Employer as the result of the execution of a $\mathrm{Bid} /$ ProposalSecuring Declaration.
4.10 An Applicant shall provide such documentary evidence of eligibility satisfactory to the Employer, as the Employer shall reasonably request.
4.11 A firm that is under a sanction of debarment by the Borrower from being awarded a contract is eligible to participate in this procurement, unless the Bank, at the Borrower's request, is satisfied that the debarment; (a) relates to fraud or corruption, and (b) followed a judicial or administrative proceeding that afforded the firm adequate due process.

## 5. Eligibility

5.1 Firms and individuals may be ineligible if they are nationals of ineligible countries as indicated in Section V. The countries, persons or entities are ineligible if:
(a) as a matter of law or official regulations, the Borrower's country prohibits commercial relations with that country, provided that the Bank is satisfied that such exclusion does not preclude effective competition for the supply of goods or the contracting of works or services required; or
(b) by an act of compliance with a decision of the United Nations Security Council taken under Chapter VII of the Charter of the United Nations, the Borrower's country prohibits any import of goods or contracting of works or services from that country, or any payments to any country, person, or entity in that country.
5.2 When the Works are implemented across jurisdictional boundaries (and more than one country is a Borrower, and is involved in the procurement), then exclusion of a firm or individual on the basis of ITA 5.1(a) above by any country may be applied to that procurement across other countries involved, if the Bank and the Borrowers involved in the procurement agree.

6.1 This Prequalification Document consists of parts 1 and 2 which comprise all the sections indicated below, and which should be read in conjunction with any Addendum issued in accordance with ITA 8.

## PART 2 Works Requirements

## - Section VII - Scope of Works

6.2 Unless obtained directly from the Employer, the Employer accepts no responsibility for the completeness of the document, responses to requests for clarification, the minutes of the preApplication meeting (if any), or Addenda to the Prequalification Document in accordance with ITA 8. In case of any discrepancies, documents issued directly by the Employer shall prevail.
6.3 The Applicant is expected to examine all instructions, forms, and terms in the Prequalification Document and to furnish with its Application all information or documentation as is required by the Prequalification Document.
7.1 An Applicant requiring any clarification of the Prequalification Document shall contact the Employer in writing at the Employer's address indicated in the PDS. The Employer will respond in writing to any request for clarification provided that such request is received no later than fourteen (14) days prior to the deadline for submission of the applications. The Employer shall forward a copy of its response to all prospective Applicants who have obtained the Prequalification Document directly from the Employer, including a description of the inquiry but without identifying its source. If so indicated in the PDS, the Employer shall also promptly publish its response at the web page identified in the PDS. Should the Employer deem it necessary to amend the Prequalification Document as a result
of a clarification, it shall do so following the procedure under ITA 8. and in accordance with the provisions of ITA 17.2.
7.2 If indicated in the PDS, the Applicant's designated representative is invited at the Applicant's cost to attend a preApplication meeting at the place, date and time mentioned in the PDS. During this pre-Application meeting, prospective Applicants may request clarification of the project requirement, the criteria for qualifications or any other aspects of the Prequalification Document.
7.3 Minutes of the pre-Application meeting, if applicable, including the text of the questions asked by Applicants, including those during the meeting (without identifying the source) and the responses given, together with any responses prepared after the meeting will be transmitted promptly to all prospective Applicants who have obtained the Prequalification Document. Any modification to the Prequalification Document that may become necessary as a result of the pre-Application meeting shall be made by the Employer exclusively through the use of an Addendum pursuant to ITA 8. Non-attendance at the preApplication meeting will not be a cause for disqualification of an Applicant.
8. Amendment of Prequalification Document
8.1 At any time prior to the deadline for submission of Applications, the Employer may amend the Prequalification Document by issuing an Addendum.
8.2 Any Addendum issued shall be part of the Prequalification Document and shall be communicated in writing to all Applicants who have obtained the Prequalification Document from the Employer. The Employer shall promptly publish the Addendum at the Employer's web page identified in the PDS.
8.3 To give Applicants reasonable time to take an Addendum into account in preparing their Applications, the Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Applications in accordance with ITA 17.2.

## C. Preparation of Applications

9. Cost of Applications 9.1 The Applicant shall bear all costs associated with the preparation and submission of its Application. The Employer will in no case be responsible or liable for those costs, regardless of the conduct

11. Documents<br>Comprising the Application

10.1 The Application as well as all correspondence and documents relating to the prequalification exchanged by the Applicant and the Employer, shall be written in the language specified in the PDS. Supporting documents and printed literature that are part of the Application may be in another language, provided they are accompanied by an accurate translation of the relevant passages in the language specified in the PDS, in which case, for purposes of interpretation of the Application, the translation shall govem.
11.1 The Application shall comprise the following:
(a) Application Submission Letter, in accordance with ITA 12.1;
(b) Eligibility: documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's eligibility, in accordance with ITA 13.1;
(c) Qualifications: documentary evidence establishing the Applicant's qualifications, in accordance with ITA 14; and
(d) any other document required as specified in the PDS,
11.2 The Applicant shall furnish information on commissions and gratuities, if any, paid or to be paid to agents or any other party relating to this Application
12.1 The Applicant shall complete an Application Submission Letter as provided in Section IV (Application Forms). This Letter must be completed without any alteration to its format.
13.1 To establish its eligibility in accordance with ITA 4, the Applicant shall complete the eligibility declarations in the Application Submission Letter and Forms ELI (eligibility) 1.1 and 1.2, included in Section IV (Application Forms).
14.1 To establish its qualifications to perform the contract(s) in accordance with Section III, Qualification Criteria and Requirements, the Applicant shall provide the information requested in the corresponding Information Sheets included in Section IV (Application Forms).
14.2 Wherever an Application Form requires an Applicant to state a monetary amount, Applicants should indicate the USD equivalent using the rate of exchange determined as follows:
(a) For construction turnover or financial data required for each year - Exchange rate prevailing on the last day of

the respective calendar year (in which the amounts for that year is to be converted).
(b) Value of single contract - Exchange rate prevailing on the date of the contract.
Exchange rates shall be taken from the publicly available source identified in the PDS. Any error in determining the exchange rates in the Application may be corrected by the Employer.
15.1 The Applicant shall prepare one original of the documents comprising the Application as described in ITA 11 and clearly mark it "ORIGINAL". The original of the Application shall be typed or written in indelible ink and shall be signed by a person duly authorized to sign on behalf of the Applicant. In case the Applicant is a JV, the Application shall be signed by an authorized representative of the JV on behalf of the JV and so as to be legally binding on all the members as evidenced by a power of attorney signed by their legally authorized signatories.
15.2 The Applicant shall submit copies of the signed original Application, in the number specified in the PDS, and clearly mark them "COPY". In the event of any discrepancy between the original and the copies, the original shall prevail.

## D. Submission of Applications

16.1 The Applicant shall enclose the original and the copies of the Application in a sealed envelope that shall:
(a) bear the name and address of the Applicant;
(b) be addressed to the Employer, in accordance with ITA 17.1; and
(c) bear the specific identification of this prequalification process indicated in the PDS 1.1.
16.2 The Employer will accept no responsibility for not processing any envelope that was not identified as required in ITA 16.1 above.
17.1 Applicants may either submit their Applications by mail or by hand. Applications shall be received by the Employer at the address and no later than the deadline indicated in the PDS. When so specified in the PDS, Applicants have the option of submitting their Applications electronically, in accordance with electronic Application submission procedures specified

17.2 The Employer may, at its discretion, extend the deadline for the submission of Applications by amending the Prequalification Document in accordance with ITA 8, in which case all rights and obligations of the Employer and the Applicants subject to the previous deadline shall thereafter be subject to the deadline as extended.
18.1 The Employer reserves the right to accept applications received after the deadline for submission of applications, unless otherwise specified in the PDS.
19.1 The Employer shall open all Applications at the date, time and place specified in the PDS. Late Applications shall be treated in accordance with ITA 18.1.
19.2 Applications submitted electronically (if permitted pursuant to ITA 17.1) shall be opened in accordance with the procedures specified in the PDS.
19.3 The Employer shall prepare a record of the opening of Applications to include, as a minimum, the name of the Applicants. A copy of the record shall be distributed to all Applicants.

## E. Procedures for Evaluation of Applications

20.1 Information relating to the Applications, their evaluation and results of the prequalification shall not be disclosed to Applicants or any other persons not officially concerned with the prequalification process until the notification of prequalification results is made to all Applicants in accordance with ITA 28.
20.2 From the deadline for submission of Applications to the time of notification of the results of the prequalification in accordance with ITA 28. any Applicant that wishes to contact the Employer on any matter related to the prequalification process may do so only in writing.
21.1 To assist in the evaluation of Applications, the Employer may, at its discretion, ask an Applicant for a clarification (including missing documents) of its Application, to be submitted within a stated reasonable period of time. Any request for clarification from the Employer and all clarifications from the Applicant shall
be in writing.
21.2 If an Applicant does not provide clarifications and/or documents requested by the date and time set in the Employer's request for clarification, its Application shall be evaluated based on the information and documents available at the time of evaluation of the Application.

## 22. Responsiveness of Applications

24. Subcontractors
22.1 The Employer may reject any Application which is not responsive to the requirements of the Prequalification Document. In case the information furnished by the Applicant is incomplete or otherwise requires clarification as per ITA 21.1, and the Applicant fails to provide satisfactory clarification and/or missing information, it may result in disqualification of the Applicant.
23.1 Unless otherwise specified in the PDS, a margin of preference for domestic bidders ${ }^{2}$ shall not apply in the Bidding process resulting from this prequalification.
24.1 Unless otherwise stated in the PDS, the Employer does not intend to execute any specific elements of the Works by subcontractors selected in advance by the Employer (so-called "Nominated Subcontractors").
24.2 The Applicant shall not propose to subcontract the whole of the Works. The Employer, in ITA 25.2, may permit the Applicant to propose subcontractors for certain specialized parts of the work as indicated therein as ("Specialized Subcontractors"). Applicants planning to use such Specialized Subcontractors shall specify, in the Application Submission Letter, the activity(ies) or parts of the Works proposed to be subcontracted along with details of the proposed subcontractors including their qualification and experience.

## F. Evaluation of Applications and Prequalification of Applicants

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## 25. Evaluation of Applications

25.1 The Employer shall use the factors, methods, criteria, and requirements defined in Section III, Qualification Criteria and Requirements, to evaluate the qualifications of the Applicants, and no other methods, criteria, or requirements shall be used. The Employer reserves the right to waive minor deviations from the qualification criteria if they do not materially affect the technical capability and financial resources of an Applicant to perform the Contract.
25.2 Subcontractors proposed by the Applicant shall be fully qualified for their parts of the Works. The subcontractor's qualifications shall not be used by the Applicant to qualify for the Works unless their parts of the Works were previously designated by the Employer in the PDS as can be met by Specialized Subcontractors, in which case, the qualifications of the Specialized Subcontractor proposed by the Applicant may be added to the qualifications of the Applicant for the purpose of the evaluation.
25.3 In case of multiple contracts, Applicants should indicate in their Applications the individual contract or combination of contracts in which they are interested. The Employer shall prequalify each Applicant for the maximum combination of contracts for which the Applicant has thereby indicated its interest and for which the Applicant meets the appropriate aggregate requirements. The qualification criteria and requirements are specified in Section III.
25.4 However, with respect to the specific experience under item Section III (Qualification Criteria and Requirements), 4.2 (a), the Employer will select any one or more of the options as identified below:
$\mathbf{N}$ is the minimum number of contracts
$V$ is the minimum value of a single contract.

## (a) Prequalification for one Contract:

25.5 Only the qualifications of the Applicant shall be considered. The qualifications of other firms, including the Applicant's subsidiaries, parent entities, affiliates, subcontractors (other than Specialized Subcontractors in accordance with ITA 25.2

above) or any other firms) different from the Applicant shall not be considered.
26.1 The Employer reserves the right to accept or reject any Application, and to annul the prequalification process and reject all Applications at any time, without thereby incurring any liability to the Applicants.
27.1 All Applicants whose Applications substantially meet or exceed the specified qualification requirements will be prequalified by the Employer.
27.2 An Applicant may be "conditionally prequalified," that is, qualified subject to the Applicant submitting or correcting certain specified nonmaterial documents or deficiencies to the satisfaction of the Employer.
27.3 Applicants that are conditionally prequalified will be so informed along with the statement of the conditions) which must be met to the satisfaction of the Employer before or at the time of submitting their Bids.
28.1 The Employer shall notify all Applicants in writing of the names of those Applicants who have been prequalified or conditionally prequalified. In addition, those Applicants who have been disqualified will be informed separately.
28.2 Applicants that have not been prequalified may write to the Employer to request, in writing, the grounds on which they were disqualified.
29.1 Promptly after the notification of the results of the prequalification, the Employer shall invite Bids from all the Applicants that have been prequalified or conditionally prequalified.
29.2 Bidders may be required to provide a Bid Security or a BidSecuring Declaration acceptable to the Employer in the form and an amount to be specified in the bidding document.
29.3 The successful Bidder shall be required to provide a Performance Security as specified in the bidding document.
29.4 If applicable, the successful Bidder shall be required to provide a separate Environmental, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) Performance Security.
29.5 Bidders shall be required to provide the Code of Conduct which will apply to their employees and sub-contractors to

ensure compliance with the Environmental, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) requirements.
29.6 Bidders shall be required to submit management strategies and implementation plans to ensure compliance with key Environmental, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) requirements.
30.1 Any change in the structure or formation of an Applicant after being prequalified in accordance with ITA 27 and invited to bid (including, in the case of a JV, any change in the structure or formation of any member and also including any change in any specialized subcontractor whose qualifications were considered to prequalify the Applicant) shall be subject to the written approval of the Employer prior to the deadline for submission of Bids. Such approval shall be denied if (i) a prequalified applicant proposes to associate with a disqualified applicant or in case of a disqualified joint venture, any of its members; (ii) as a consequence of the change, the Applicant no longer substantially meets the qualification criteria set forth in Section III (Qualification Criteria and Requirements); or (iii) in the opinion of the Employer, the change may result in a substantial reduction in competition. Any such change should be submitted to the Employer not later than fourteen (14) days after the date of the Request for Bids.
31.1 The procedures for making a Procurement-related Complaint are as specified in the PDS.

## Section VI - Fraud and Corruption

## 1. Purpose

(b) acts intended to materially impede the exercise of the Bank's inspection and audit rights provided for under paragraph 2.2 e . below.

b. Rejects a proposal for award if the Bank determines that the firm or individual recommended for award, any of its personnel, or its agents, or its sub-consultants, subcontractors, service providers, suppliers and/ or their employees, has, directly or indirectly, engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices in competing for the contract in question;
c. In addition to the legal remedies set out in the relevant Legal Agreement, may take other appropriate actions, including declaring misprocurement, if the Bank determines at any time that representatives of the Borrower or of a recipient of any part of the proceeds of the loan engaged in corrupt, fraudulent, collusive, coercive, or obstructive practices during the procurement process, selection and/or execution of the contract in question, without the Borrower having taken timely and appropriate action satisfactory to the Bank to address such practices when they occur, including by failing to inform the Bank in a timely manner at the time they knew of the practices;
d. ## 1. Description of the Works

Petroleum Pipeline Corporation, BOTAŞ, intends to extend the capacity of existing underground gas storage (UGS) facility from 1 BCM to 5 BCM , daily withdrawal capacity from 40 Million $\mathrm{Sm}^{3}$ to 80 Million $\mathrm{Sm}^{3}$ and injection capacity from 30 Million $\mathrm{Sm}^{3}$ to 60 Million $\mathrm{Sm}^{3}$. Project site is located approximately 200 km south of Ankara in the central part of Turkey, approximately 40 km south of Tuz Golu (Salt Lake).

The objective of Gas Storage Expansion Project is to provide reliability and stability of the country's natural gas consumption by obtaining the urgently needed gas storage requirement of the gas network infrastructure. This facility will assist the gas network to prevent any constraints regarding on the potential forthcoming peak demands. (See Map-1, below)


Map-1: Gas Storage Expansion Project Location Map.

Gas Storage Expansion Project intends to construct a complete facility according to the international standards capable of storing a working gas volume of about 4 billion $\mathrm{m}^{3}$ of natural gas which will be composed of the following project components but not limited to:

- Construction of Water and brine pipelines,
- Construction of Subsurface Facilities
- Construction of Surface Facilities
- Gas pipeline interconnection between Kayseri-Konya-Seydisehir sections (at app. 23 km north of the project site) of the existing Eastern Anatolia Natural Gas Main Transmission Line ( $40^{\prime \prime}$ diameter) to the project site.


## Water and brine pipelines:

Gas Storage Expansion Project is composed of the Supply and Installation of approximately 120 km . steel water supply pipeline with 3 pump stations, 5 reservoirs and 40 km . glass reinforced plastic brine discharge pipeline and energy transmission lines. Water Supply Pipeline (app. 120 km .) with a diameter of $52^{\prime \prime}$ to $56^{\prime \prime}$ from Hirfanli Dam reservoir, located in app. 200 km . south of Ankara, to the project site and Brine Discharge Pipeline (app. 40 km .) with a diameter of $56^{\prime \prime}$ for the discharge of brine generated as a result of salt deposit solution mining $\left(10.000 \mathrm{~m}^{3} / \mathrm{hr}\right)$ to Tuz Golu.

## Subsurface Facilities:

Within the scope of the Gas Storage Expansion Project, it is intended to create a series of underground gas storage caverns by controlled fresh water solution mining of (leaching) underground natural salt formations. Each cavern will be developed at the depths of $1100-1400 \mathrm{~m}$, have a physical free volume of approximately $630.000-750.000 \mathrm{~m}^{3}$ and the total working gas volume will be about 4 Billion $\mathrm{m}^{3}$ in 48 (forty-eight) cavems.

To establish the technical feasibility of the Tuz Golu salt structure, BOTAS evaluated the seismic characteristics of the site, drilled two test wells, recovered salt cores and established the mechanical characteristics of the salt, and hydrological requirements for solution mining water supply and brine disposal.

The Supply and Installation of Surface and Sub-Surface Facilities and Cavern Leaching Process of Gas Storage Expansion Project consist of construction of surface facilities and
subsurface facilities and relevant operations.
The scope of sub-surface facilities / works will be as follows but not limited to:

- Reviewing the Basic Design Study for Sub-Surface facilities of Gas Storage Expansion Project
- Preparation of detail engineering study of Gas Storage Expansion Project
- Supply of material, equipment and services
- Installation of equipment
- Drilling of 48 new cavern wells with adequate subsurface installation,
- Solution mining of 48 salt caverns for natural gas storage (each cavern with a free geometrical volume approximately $630.000-750.000 \mathrm{~m}^{3}$ )
- First gas filling for each cavern,
- Snubbing operations for each cavern.
- Commissioning of each cavern
- Partial Completion ( 12 caverns at 2021, 12 caverns at 2022, 24 caverns at 2023) and operation of caverns until the Operation Acceptance of Facilities.


## Surface Facilities:

The scope of surface facilities / works will be as follows but not limited to:

- Reviewing the Basic Design Study for Surface facilities of Gas Storage Expansion Project
- Preparation of Detail Engineering Study of Gas Storage Expansion Project.
- Supply and Installation of technological units such as; pig stations, compressors, drivers, gas measuring units, filters and separators, heaters, coolers, drying plants, dehydration units, leaching pumps, caver heads, dilution pumps, blanket units, fuel gas supply system, transport pipelines, storage tanks, flare system, vent systems, pressure control system, power supply system, power generators, instrumentation, cables, unit and plant controlling system, automation components, SCADA, auxiliary and supporting equipment, connecting piping, connecting piping with valves, field piping system and connecting manifold, etc.
- Steel constructions, supporting constructions
- Civil works, base plates, basement, ground works
- Technological buildings, utility buildings, stores, social and sanitary buildings
- Roads and outside facilities
- Safety systems (gas-warning system, fire alarm system, fire-fighting system, fail-safesupervising systems)
- Tank farm
- Energy transmission lines for Leaching Pumps and Surface facilities.

Employer will pay for cushion gas and electricity consumed by water transportation pumps and leaching pumps.


## 2. Construction Period

- Estimated contract completion date: November 2023


## 3. Site and Other Data

The nearest international airport to the project site is in Ankara whereas a domestic airport exists in Konya, a city located with a distance of 130 km to the project site. Transportation to Sultanhan from Ankara takes nearly 4 hours by vehicle. In addition, the nearest harbour to the project site is located in Mersin, app. 260 km to the project site.

A national environmental impact assessment (EIA) report was prepared for Tuz Gölü UGS Expansion Project in accordance with Turkish EIA Regulation by "ÇINAR Mühendislik Müşavirlik A.Ş.", a Turkish environmental company which is accredited by The Ministry of Environment and Urbanization (MoEU), and was submitted to MoEU on 27.01.2017.

Environmental management, ecology, social impacts, land, air and water contamination, hydrology, meteorology, geology, geotechnics and geophysics, etc. are taken into consideration in this EIA study. Determination of possible positive and negative effects of the project on the environment, precautions to prevent or minimise negative impacts on environment, technological solutions and studies which will be conducted during monitoring and controlling of the application of the project are discussed in detail in the mentioned EIA study.

In addition to the national EIA report (which is pending for approval from MoEU), CINAR Muhendislik Musavirlik A.S. is also preparing an Environmental and Social Impact Assessment (ESIA) report for the project. The ESIA is being prepared to meet the safeguard requirements of the potential international lenders. The ESIA, when finalized, will be shared with the bidders together with the national EIA report by BOTAS. Bidders should be informed that the ESIA and all of the supporting documents and its full compliance will be a part of the contract with the awarded bidder.

### 3.1. Metcorological and Climatic Characteristics

The terrestrial climate is prevailing in the said province, which is characterized as cold and rainy in winters, but hot and arid in summers. The coldest month is January while the hottest month is July.

In this study, the closest stations to the proposed project site are Aksaray and Karapinar Meteorology Stations. Aksaray Meteorology Station is located at approximately 60 km northeast of the project site while Karapinar Meteorology Station is located at approximately 80 km south
of the project site. Since there are not significant topographical altitudes between Aksaray Meteorology Station and the proposed project site, it is anticipated that the data of this station will better represent the meteorological characteristics of the region.

### 3.2. Temperature Regime

The annual average temperatures recorded in Aksaray and Karapinar Meteorology Stations are close and correspond to $11.9^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $10.9^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ respectively. According to both stations, the temperatures in the region are in an increasing trend from January to July and it decreases regularly from August to December. The lowest temperature recorded in the stations is in February and the temperatures are $-29^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ and $-26.8^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ respectively for Aksaray and Karapinar meteorology stations. The maximum temperature recorded in Aksaray meteorology station is $38.4^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ in August while this value is $40.1^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ in July for Karapinar meteorology station.

### 3.3. Precipitation (Rain) Regime

Total annual average precipitation was recorded as 360.3 mm in Aksaray Meteorology Station and 290.1 mm in Karapinar Meteorology Station in the region. The seasons when the precipitation most intense are winter and spring. According to the both stations, approximately $31 \%$ of total annual precipitation occurs in winter. The percentage of precipitation in the spring within the total annual precipitation is approximately $37.3 \%$ for Aksaray Meteorology Station and $34.7 \%$ for Karapinar Meteorology Station. According to the data recorded in both stations during 1980-1999, it is observed that the most precipitation occurs in April and the less occurs in August.

The number of snowy days in both stations is close to each other and corresponds to 59.3 and 62.7 respectively. The highest snow cover is not different for both of the said stations and recorded as 41 cm .

### 3.4. Wind Direction and Velocity

According to the data recorded in Aksaray Meteorology Station, the prevailing wind direction is east - northeast (ENE) (19\%). In addition to these directions, the distribution of winds from the direction of northeast ( NE ) and north - northeast ( NNE ) is $12.8 \%$ and $7.9 \%$ respectively.

According to the data recorded in Karapinar Meteorology Station, the prevailing wind direction is north - northeast (NNE) ( $20 \%$ ). In addition to these directions, the distribution of winds from the direction of north $(\mathrm{N})$ and northeast $(\mathrm{NE})$ is $12.4 \%$ and $8.5 \%$ respectively.

### 3.5. Geological Characteristics (Physical-chemical characteristics, tectonic movements, mineral sources, landslide, unique formations, avalanche, flood, rock fall etc.)

The project site and its vicinity are located on an area where Pliocene age sediments are widespread. Pliocene sedimentary series are comprised of pebble, syncline cross-layered, loose and medium thinly bedded sandstone, marl and occasionally tuff interbeds and silt. The thickness of the unit is approximately 150 m and this unit does not have much importance with respect to bearing the groundwater.

### 3.5.1. Seismic Activity of Region

In the mentioned studies, the active faults in the region have been investigated and the earthquakes that have occurred throughout the history or that may occur in the future have been determined. According to the information gathered, comments have been made on the relation of active faults of the region with earthquake and the largest earthquake expected in the region. Furthermore, the active faults where the large earthquakes have occurred although far away from the region have been examined with respect to the fact that any earthquake that may occur may impact the region. In conclusion, the project site is located in one of the most stable regions of Anatolia that has the least active seismic character.

### 3.5.2. Thermal and Geothermal Water Sources

There is not any thermal or geothermal water source in the project site and vicinity of the proposed Tuz Gölü Basin, Gas Storage Expansion Project. However, there is Ziga Thermal Spring and Ihlara Spring in the District of Guzelyurt, and Hamambogazi Tuzlusu Thermal Spring in the Central District of the Province of Aksaray. The thermal spring potential of the Province of Aksaray is $101 \mathrm{hm}^{3} /$ year. The Ihlara Spring is located at approximately 64 km east of the project site.

Various studies have been performed by the General Directorate of Mineral Exploration

and Research (MTA) in Riga - Belisirma Geothermal Area which is located at approximately 75 km east of the project site. According to the results obtained in the said studies, the total flow rate of Riga Hot Water Spring at $32-51^{\circ} \mathrm{C}$ is approximately $41 / \mathrm{s}$ (MTA, 1996).

### 3.6. Hydrological and Ecological Characteristics

There is not any surface water in the proposed project site and its vicinity. However, important surface water sources in the Province of Aksaray are provided below under subtitles.

### 3.6.1. Rivers

Although there is not any surface water source in the vicinity of the proposed project site, the information about the surface water sources in the vicinity of the project site is given under the following subtitles in order to make assessment of the present situation in the region.

Melendiz Creek, one of the most important water sources in the region, is located at approximately 62.5 km east of the project site.

Pecenekozu Creek is located at approximately 58 km northeast of the project site.

### 3.6.2. Lakes

The nearest lake to the proposed project site is Lake Bezirci, which is located at approximately 8 km northwest of the site. In addition to this, another important lake is Tuz Gollü and the said lake is located at approximately 40 km north of the proposed project site. Since the brine that will occur within the scope of the project will be discharged into Tuz Gölü, this lake is quite important. Besides the foregoing lakes, there is not any lake in the project site and its vicinity, and information about the lakes in the region is given under the following subtitles in order to assess the present condition in the region.

Bezirci Lake is located at approximately 8 km northwest of the project site and at approximately 2.5 km east of Gunesli Village.

Tuz Gölü is the second largest lake of Turkey following Van Lake. The lake, which is located at approximately 40 km north of the proposed project site, is generally arid (please refer to Figure 4.16). The water in the lake which is filled in the winter season only regresses to a great extent and there is only a water layer near Kochisar in the centre and a little water in the south part of the lake, and other parts ( $90 \%$ ) are completely dry during summer. Its surface area is

approximately $1620 \mathrm{~km}^{2}$, altitude is 899 m and depth is maximum 5.0 m . Approximately $400 \mathrm{~km}^{2}$ part of the lake is within the Province of Aksaray. Tuz Gölū is a designated 'Special Environment Conservation Site' by Turkish authorities. The prime characteristic of the lake is its salty water. Since the water evaporates in summer, the depth of the lake decreases to 2 m and hard salt layers with a thickness ranging from 2.0 cm to 2.0 m occurs.

Tuz Gölü is located in the least rainy part of Turkey. The feeding basin of the lake has an alluvium, gypsum and calcareous structure. The lake impacts the climate in this region and the solar rays reflecting in the lake which turns into a luminous salt layer after drying in summers prevent over temperatures in the region. Heavy winds blow over the lake towards Aksaray in winters.

The other sources are the Mamasun Dam Pond, Lake Esmekaya, Helvadere Pond, Guzelyurt Pond, Balci Pond and Ciftevi Pond which are approximately $30-95 \mathrm{~km}$ far from the project site.

# 4. Environmental, Social, Health and Safety (ESHS) Requirement 

## ROTAS' ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL POLICY

As stated in section 'VII.1. Description of Works', BOTAS will provide the national EIA and the international ESIA report to the prequalified bidders. The awarded contractor will be responsible for the implementation of the ESIA commitments, which will be summarized in the Environmental and Social Management Plan section of the ESIA together with respective responsible parties and associated costs. In addition, the following policy will be followed by the awarded contractor as a minimum standard.

1. apply good international industry practice to protect and conserve the natural environment and to minimize unavoidable impacts;
2. provide and maintain a healthy and safe work environment and safe systems of work;
3. protect the health and safety of local communities and users, with particular concern for those who are disabled, elderly, or otherwise vulnerable;
4. ensure that terms of employment and working conditions of all workers engaged in the Works meet the requirements of the ILO labour conventions to which the host country is a signatory;
5. be intolerant of, and enforce disciplinary measures for illegal activities. To be intolerant of, and enforce disciplinary measures for GBV, child sacrifice, child defilement, and sexual harassment;
6. incorporate a gender perspective and provide an enabling environment where women and men have equal opportunity to participate in, and benefit from, planning and development of the Works;
7. work co-operatively, including with end users of the Works, relevant authorities, contractors and local communities;
8. engage with and listen to affected persons and organizations and be responsive to their concerns, with special regard for vulnerable, disabled, and elderly people;
9. provide an environment that fosters the exchange of information, views, and ideas that is free of any fear of retaliation;
10. minimize the risk of HIV transmission and to mitigate the effects of HIV/AIDS associated with the execution of the Works;
